What aspects of this course need improvement?


1. My biggest issue is that this just felt like a philosophy course. I understand that there is going to be a lot of overlap between political theory and philosophy, but I don't feel that we ever really applied the ancient concepts to what is going on in the world today. This is more about the instructor than the course, but I found it a little frustrating that it took so long for us to get our mid-term exams and mid-term papers back. It would be helpful to have them earlier so that we would know what grade we needed to make on the final exam and paper. I understand that instructors are human, of course, but maybe next time assign less papers (or shorter ones) if getting them graded is going to be a struggle.
2. Lowe is a bit slow on the grading but when we do get our grades back they are fair and have very detailed explanations as to why we received the grade that we did. Also, he extends due date according to if the relevant previous assignment was handed back later than expected, which I think is very sensible and fair.
3. The readings of the course changed a lot, so I just wish there was a more defined schedule that was stuck with
4. I wish the schedule of the class was more structured. Assignments and readings were constantly shifted I felt like i never knew when to expect a quiz and i think the final paper made the end of the semester unnecessarily messy. The professor should have just given up on it when he realized we were running behind, we already have a real final anyway. Prompts and quiz questions were incredibly unclear too and the essays were graded hard as if there was one specific answer he was looking for and expected us to read his mind. Understanding the quiz questions was harder than understanding the philosophical texts. I think the grading took long because he wanted to give comments but ultimately the process was more frustrating than helpful
5. The essay topics were too complex for the restricted format they were required to be answered in. However, we were allowed to come up with our own prompts.
6. For the love of God himself, give this man a class that starts at 10:00 when people will actually be awake and responsive in class. The biggest hindrance was unresponsive students.
7. Lectures at times could feel like summaries of the readings - I don't know if there's a better form of lecture and it probably didn't help that we largely didn't talk or ask questions

9. Maybe more time for the papers, and maybe have a class later in the morning, as it was difficult to make it on time for a 8:30 A.M class.
10. There was difficulty in connecting the material to the course themes. It was difficult for the themes present in the books to be connected to the topic of Political Theory.
11. the grading system is strange and feels weird. 3rd essay prompts were unclear. each final exam question had far too many parts in the question.
12. It would be better if there weren't as many readings. I think we spent a lot of time talking about ancient philosophy and not enough time was spent on the moderns. It would also be interesting if we could've read Thomas Hobbes and John Locke and compared the two to each other.

Additional comments:

1. Thank you for not requiring a ridiculously expensive and pointless textbook. Also not Lowe's fault at all but the classroom had almost no electrical outlets. Not good for a college where many students use laptops to take notes.
2. I saw no point in reading the plays by Aristophanes because The Apology pretty much covered the same thing. Feel like we could have just spent a day discussing Aristophanes it was dragged out too long.
